Literature-Databank (from journals only)

For the development of a literature databank from journals, we ask our authors to provide the abstracts of the cited articles. Electronic presentation is, of course, preferred, and as long as own publications are concerned, this should be possible.

Online Editions: Databank – Online-First – Web Edition

Two modifications are already available to you:

1. The **databank** of published articles which can be called up by keywords. It has been active since 1998 (<http://www.scientificjournals.com/db>).
2. The **Online-First** forum with the available articles which have been accepted for publication. It has been active since October 1999 (<http://www.scientificjournals.com/onlinefirst>).

Parallel to the preparations for printing, the databank is actualized and Online-First is updated immediately following the final acceptance of the articles and the completion of corrections by the author.

The third module, entitled **Web Edition**, provides access to the published articles by way of the **Table of Contents** of every individual new issue (with access via the Online Editions) and will be available beginning at the **end of January 2000** (<http://www.scientificjournals.com/wb>). This third online version is more or less identical with the printed issue. Nevertheless, we will also employ the specific possibilities available to the internet; references will be made concerning the different individual forms of the articles in each of the printed issues.

The three Online Editions (up to and including the abstracts) are available to anyone who is interested. A password (PW) must be entered as soon as the full article is to be called up. The PW is your six-digit order number which you have received from our prescription service when you first subscribed for our publication (or from the editorial staff, mail to: s.rapp@ecommed.de). **Library access** is available via the IP address.

Please also note the **home pages** of the individual journals (which can be reached most readily via the start page, <http://www.scientificjournals.com>). These sites are accessible to all and will provide full information concerning the periodical itself, as well as about any alterations. In addition, the editorials and tables of contents, as well as a broad presentation of all the articles which are not to be found in one of the Online Editions, are available here. These sites also undergo continuous actualizations.

Last but not least, there is the **Global LCA Village** (LCA Internet Discussion Forum) at <http://www.scientificjournals.com/lca/village/>, which has grown very nicely. It deserves a 'click' once a week and invites for contributions.
